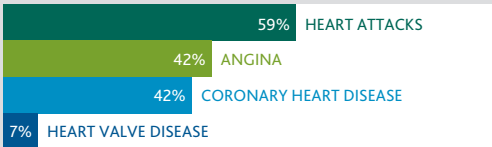

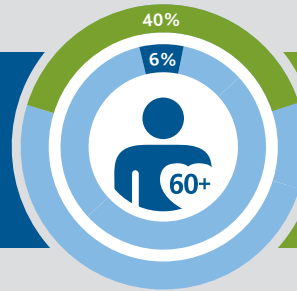

HEART VALVE DISEASE AWARENESS

Over 60s are most familiar with heart attacks (59%),
angina (42%) and coronary heart disease (38%) with
only 7% familiar with heart valve disease (HVD)¹



Only 6% of over 60s
know what aortic
stenosis is,¹ the most
common form of
heart valve disease²



40% of over
60s do not
know there are
four valves in
the heart¹



HEART VALVE DISEASE CONCERN

LESS THAN 3%
of over 60s say that **heart valve disease**
is the condition that gives them **significant**
concern compared to other illnesses¹

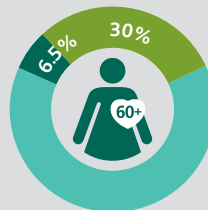
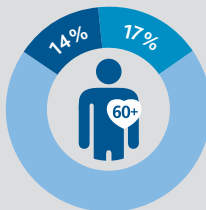
Alarming, after being told more about

STETHOSCOPE USE

72%

never checks their heart
with a stethoscope¹,
despite stethoscope use
being one of the first
steps in detecting HVD⁵

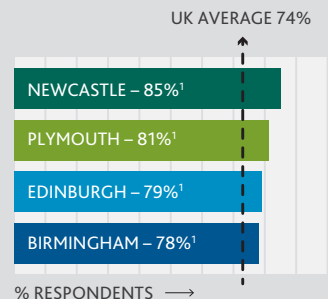
14% of men versus 6.5% of women saying their heart
was checked with a stethoscope at every doctor visit¹
