


HEART VALVE DISEASE: A COMMON, SERIOUS BUT TREATABLE CONDITION

Heart valve disease primarily affects the older generation and is a growing cause of concern as the population ages⁴



If severe aortic stenosis is left untreated, 50% of patients will die within 2 years of developing symptoms. Patients can regain their quality of life and life expectancy with heart valve repair or replacement³

Within 20 years:



155 million Europeans will be aged over 651 20 million people over 65 will have HVD^{1,3}





STETHOSCOPE CHECKS – SAVING PATIENTS BY LISTENING TO THEIR HEARTS

Listening to the heart with a stethoscope for a 'heart murmur' is a key step to detection⁵

There is **substantial** variance in stethoscope use at every GP visit throughout Europe²





6% of older British people claim to receive a stethoscope **check** at every GP visit in the UK²
